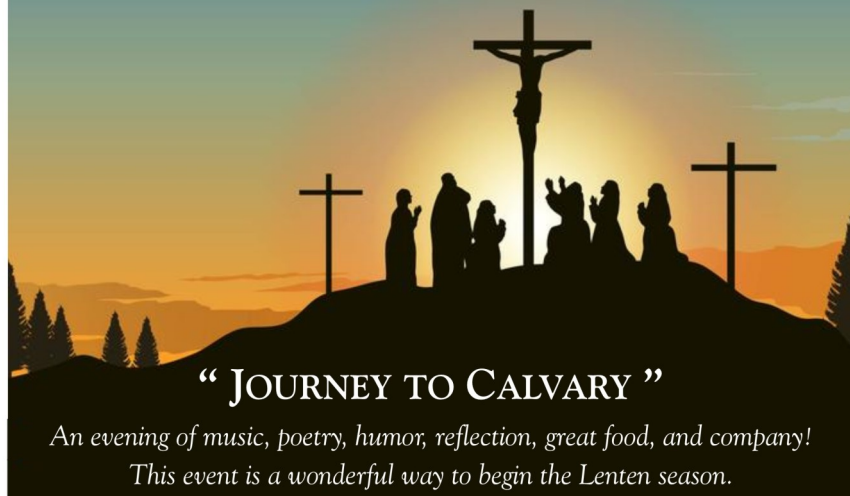

Cathedral Parking Lot Reminders

Weekday Parking Reminder – the Cathedral parking lot is restricted on weekdays between 8:00 am to 5:00 pm for parish staff parking and volunteers if space is available.

Weekend Parking Reminders - Most of our staff members do also need to use the Cathedral parking lot on the weekends. We have had instances where both **Clergy** and **staff** members haven't been able to park in their spot on the weekends. Please keep those spaces open during weekend Masses.

There is also no parking in front of the small shed door, garbage dumpster or on the grate by the east end of the Cathedral.

All parking meters are free on Sundays. On Saturdays, there are some free meters with a two hour limit. Meter parking is also free with handicapped parking placard or permit.

The Cathedral has also negotiated a parking agreement with Northwestern Mutual allowing parishioners and guests to park during weekend Masses at no charge. The agreement is available for both the Saturday and Sunday Mass schedule. This does *not* include parking during weekday Masses. 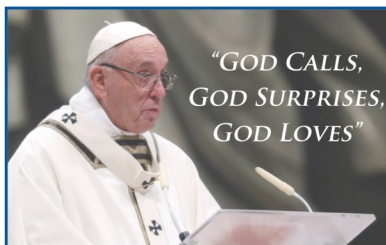

RITA FERRONE is an award-winning writer and speaker on issues of liturgy and church renewal in the Roman Catholic tradition. She is the author and coauthor of several books and is a frequent contributor to Commonweal magazine and numerous other Catholic journals. She is the former Director of Liturgy here at the Cathedral (1999-2001).



MARCH 22, 2020—GOD SURPRISES

REV. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS is a senior priest of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and celebrates Mass Sundays at Milwaukee's eastside parishes. Once a month his reflection on the Sunday scripture readings appears in the Catholic Herald. He has written numerous books, the most recent coauthored with Bishop Skiba, entitled *Easter Fire*. A forthcoming book entitled *Echoes* with reflections on each of the Sundays of Cycle B readings beginning with Advent of 2020 is scheduled for this summer.



DEACON CARLOS LONDONO was born in Medellin, Colombia. The first time he spoke about a desire to become a priest was at the age of eight. After a year of discernment at home, he joined Saint Francis de Sales Seminary in 2014, studying for the Priesthood in the Archdiocese. He was ordained a transitional deacon in April 2019 and anticipates Ordination to the Priesthood in May 2020.



DEACON PATRICK MAGNOR grew up in Brookfield WI, where the Catholic faith was always a big part of his life. At the suggestion of his parish priest during his senior year of college, he attended a discernment retreat at Saint Francis de Sales Seminary. During this retreat, he made the commitment to be open to God's will within his life. The next step was joining Saint Francis de Sales Seminary to study for the Priesthood. He was ordained a transitional deacon in April 2019 and anticipates Ordination to the Priesthood in May 2020.

CHRISTOPHER DAVIS is an experienced immersive-education facilitator in the El Paso—Ciudad Juárez region, having been a full-time volunteer with the Annunciation House. While at Annunciation House, Christopher volunteered and coordinated various houses of hospitality and was a coordinator of Annunciation House's Border Awareness Experience program. Christopher is passionate about exploring social and environmental justice topics through a combination of research and discussion, hands-on experience, and personal, community and faith-based reflection. He has a love for music and is a songwriter and performing artist.



The Supreme Example of Stewardship

In thanksgiving we reflect on all the times in the past year that our parishioners have stepped forward to give of their time, their talent and their treasure. Infant Baptism: Baptism preparation sessions are held for already registered Cathedral parish parents for the Catholic commitment they are making for their child. Please contact Pastoral Associate.

Christian Marriage: Marriages are scheduled for parishioners who have been registered for at least one year. Preparation sessions with a priest begins no later than six months before the marriage date.

Communion for the Sick: Parishioners who are confined to their home may have the Eucharist brought to them. Call the parish office and ask for the Pastoral Care extension, 603.
