Doing Time Together is an interfaith support group dedicated to working through the issues faced by those whose family members and loved ones are currently incarcerated.



The Christian Women Society invites you to experience this Italian tradition through which the parish honors St. Joseph and raises money to help those in need.

According to legend, St. Joseph's Tavolata (Table) began as a means of giving thanks to St. Joseph for his intercession during difficult times in the Middle Ages. The wealthy in the community provided tables filled with food, and those in need of that food were invited to share in the banquet.

Italians still honor St. Joseph by preparing a banquet table (tavolata) each year on (or near) his March 19th feast day. This year at Three Holy Women parish, the celebration will take place on Sunday March 15th. It includes a beautifully adorned table filled with donated meatless dishes, breads and sweets. After a blessing, the food is sold to attendees. A specially prepared cake is cut and shared with those present. Participants receive a free bread roll and a bowl of pasta with a meatless sauce, with or without fish. A raffle is held, with a variety of prizes including gift certificates, and cash prizes! Proceeds from the food sales, raffle and free will offerings are donated to the parish's social justice ministry as well as other organizations or projects in the community that provide services to people needing help.

We are grateful to those devotees of St. Joseph who donate time and money to preserve this tradition for our parish. Admission is free. Please come to take part in this wonderful tradition at <u>Holy</u> <u>Rosary Hall.</u>

Christian Marriage: Marriages are scheduled for parishioners who have been registered for at least one year. Preparation sessions with a priest begins no later than six months before the marriage date.


Communion for the Sick: Parishioners who are confined to their home may have the Eucharist brought to them. Call the parish office and ask for the Pastoral Care extension, 603.
