"Vengeance or Justice"

Biography:

Via a life sentence handed down three days after his 15th birthday for a gang-related homicide, Adam Procell spent nearly a quarter-century behind bars. During his incarceration, he renounced his gang affiliation and published 'Anatomizing the Gang Culture.' Adam is a founding partner at Paradigm Shyft, a strategic reentry consulting firm, and is working to unify Milwaukee's reentry services through a shared reentry resource model called "Home To Stay." Additionally, he wrote Act 233, a law requiring the state to establish a community reentry center, and serves as an adjunct instructor at Marquette University. He is also a TEDx speaker, highlighting his work within the trenches of change.

She is the author of over twenty-seven books, including the bestselling *When I Lay My Isaac Down*, *Speak Up with Confidence*, and *He Holds My Hand*.
